Point Values

The following point values will be used by members of the Awards Committee to determine the extent to which the applicant has addressed the items in the nomination form:

The extent to which the problem/need is clearly explained -

Up to 10 points

The ability of the program or project to meet its objectives -

Up to 10 points

The extent of public private partners in the program or project -

2 points for each private partner (10 points maximum)

The extent of intergovernmental cooperation and multi-agency cooperation in the project -

2 points for each community/agency - excluding applicant (10 points maximum)

The number of various funding sources for the program or project -

2 points for each funding source (10 points maximum)

The extent to which the program or project can be reproduced by others -

Up to 10 points

If the resident activity program or non-housing or public/community services programs continue after federal and/or state assistance are exhausted -

Up to 5 points

If the Program is innovative in approach and a strong solution to the problem -

Up to 20 points
